#### **R-6 Number Naming Overview**

#### Foundation

Connect number names, numerals and quantities, including zero, initially up to 10 and then beyond
Establish understanding of the language and processes of counting by naming numbers in sequences, initially to and from 20, moving from any starting point
Year 2
Recognise, model, represent and order numbers to at least 1000.
Year 3
Recognise, model, represent and order numbers to at least 10 000.
Year 4
Recognise, represent and order numbers to at least tens of thousands.
Year 5 – 6
Number naming is not included in the Year 5 Curriculum.

It is assumed that Year 5 and above can read any set of numbers up into the hundreds of billions.

### Quick Parent Tips to support students number naming.

**<u>PARENTS</u>**, this is a very quick and reliable assessment tool to see how students read numbers and which Place Value they are working in.

#### **Materials**

Pencil piece of paper.

Write down a number - student says the number aloud

Place a number in front of that number and repeat , repeat , repeat


#### **Example**

# Oral Language, 2024, Term 1

Oral language is the foundation of all literacy skills. It is important in the early years of learning and continues to be important throughout a child's schooling. Oral language practice can take many forms, from classroom discussions to formally assessed presentations.

As teachers, we include oral language opportunities in our unit plans at both small group and whole class level.

On Friday afternoons, the students in Room 1 will be provided with an extra opportunity to practice their oral language as well as take part in some activities to deepen specific skills. Our Friday timetable will include 3 chances for each student to bring something from home to share and talk about with the class and 4 structured sessions.

Please refer to the table below to confirm your child's sharing weeks. Our younger students might also need some guidance at home when selecting what they may like to bring to school for their turn. Items can be kept in the office if they are not suitable for lunch and recess play (e.g. Lego constructions, breakables, photographs). It would also benefit our students if they practiced at home first with focus on ensuring they know information such as ~Who, What, Why, When, Where, How~ in relation to their item.

If a week is missed due to a school event (e.g. swimming carnival) it will be rescheduled but individual student absences will not.
