In Science the students have been learning about light and how light travels. Students were asked to bring in torches and boxes so they could make peep boxes and periscopes. They were able to discover that light can travel around corners when reflected in mirrors and had a wonderful time experimenting with how they could reflect light from a number of periscopes angled together. The photo with the circle is a picture of the inside of one of the peep boxes. Students placed a torch (light source) in the box to reflect light off of an object. 












Last year the Education Department appointed an Autism Inclusion Teacher in all South Australian Primary schools.

The focus of this role last year was to work with Autistic children at our school and their parents in supporting them at school, as well as providing information and support to other staff.

This role continues and includes attendance, behaviour, learning and understanding school routines

Did you now that April is World Autism awareness Month

What is autism spectrum disorder (ASD)?

Autism spectrum disorder (ASD) is a lifelong developmental disorder. It affects how people behave and interact with the world around them.

In people with ASD, the brain does not grow in the same way it does in most people. ASD presents differently in boys and girls.

ASD is not a mental health problem or an intellectual disability. But some people with ASD will also have those problems.

Children and adults with ASD may be highly intelligent, of normal intelligence, or have an intellectual disability. Along with some challenges, an autistic person will also have a range of strengths.

Doctors used to think that <u>Asperger's syndrome</u> and autism were separate conditions. They now think that they are all part of one condition, called autism spectrum disorder or ASD. People with ASD will all have different experiences.

About 1 in 150 Australians has ASD.

This Maths game encourages players to think and use all strategies of Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication and Division.

Materials; 2 dice and the game board – easily drawn up on paper and more than 1 person can play.

How to Play; Player A - Rolls 2 dice and records what they roll.

They decide and record their strategy and ADD this number to a running total.

Repeat. Repeat. Repeat.

The closest player to 100 after all turns are taken – WINS!!and yes, you may go over 100

The game can be played with 6- or 9-sided dice.

Include a 3rd dice to provide a challenge. Increase / decrease the total score for a challenge.

To ensure the safety of our clubs and its members we ask that all volunteers please complete this training.



Don't spend all Winter cutting your wood on the ground


