



Keeping safe these holidays.

Any dog can bite

Even the friendliest dog can have a bad day and bite. But if your people follow these simple tips, everyone can stay safe and happy.


- Always supervise children around dogs.
- · Secure your dog when there's mail, deliveries or visitors on the way.
- · Never startle a dog, especially when they're sleeping.
- · Never touch a dog while it's eating.
- Never touch a dog's puppies without the owner's permission.
- Take care when entering a dog's territory, they can be territorial and bite.
- · Never put your face near a dog's face.
- Keep your gates shut and your yard secure so your dog can't escape.
- · Ask the owner's permission before approaching a dog.
- Show house guests how your dog likes to interact, and give your dog a quiet, comfy place to retreat.
- Train your dog and avoid punishment methods that create fear or aggression.
- Safely socialise your dog as soon as possible. If your dog is aggressive, see an animal behaviourist or your vet.
- If expecting a delivery, be careful when opening your front door, ensuring your dog doesn't run out from behind you.
