# **Homework for Parents with students**

In Maths, we have recently started a Measurement Unit across many grades.

**Measurement includes**: Knowing the days of the week, knowing what happens on what day, months of the year, seasons, telling the time, working out elapsed time, reading timetables, using calendars, identifying fractions for whole, halves, quarters and thirds as well as actual measuring.

As students bring many skills and importantly general knowledge to the unit it may be valuable to know what your child brings and practice some of these skills with your child.

#### **Example questions for Early Learners**

What are week days? What days are the weekend?

List the days of the week. What day is before ...... What day is after .....

List the months of the year. As above and also what is the 5<sup>th</sup> month?

Telling the time to the hour.

#### **Examples for Middle /Upper Primary**

Can they read a timetable? Can students identify and locate dates and days on a calendar?

Telling the time to the hour, half hour, quarter to and quarter past


Elapsed time. The time is 5.45 am-now it is 10.15 am - how much time has past?

#### And the favourites for everyone:

How many seconds in a minute? How many mins in an hour? How many hours in a day?

How many cms in a metre? How many meters in a km?

How many grams in a kilogram?


