If you see a snake, you should:

Leave it alone. Snakes are generally shy and will not attack unless provoked, so it's best to leave them be.


- Stay calm and quiet.
- Make sure there is a safe distance between you and the snake.
- Slowly back away in a manner that does not disturb the snake.
- Keep an eye on it from a safe distance (several metres away).
- Keep your pets safely away from it.
- Do not try to catch or kill the snake.
- If you see a snake inside your home, get all people and pets out of the room immediately. Shut the door and fill the gap underneath with a towel, then call a professional snake catcher for assistance.

Congrats to the upper girls and SJ who raised the snake alarm during the week.

Staff have spoken to the whole school regarding:

- Keeping safe distances
- Trying to keep line of sight while others call for staff
- If alone, try and keep line of sight and continue to call out
- No cubby or playing in the trees or out of bounds areas

The brown snake of approx. 1 metre was relocated to its new resting place as well as his 60 cm friend who was in the Art room.


