Anniece: When Ping lifted the dragon with her magic.


Roman: That oversize emperor got arrested

EXPERIMENT USING PLASTIC CUPS

EXPLAIN GAS DISTIBUTION USING PLASTIC CUPS

Students were given paper towel, plastic cups and bowls of water. They were also provided with an experiment procedure to follow. Students learnt the very valuable lesson of ensuring instructions are followed to achieve accurate results. All were able to see how air takes up space and escapes in water.





CHALLENGE: TO CREATE A SHOE IN 15 MINUTES

In room 2 Science students were given materials to choose from and they had to create, design and make a shoe in 15 minutes. They discovered the importance of using the correct materials for certain purposes.







MAKING GAS USING BICARB SODA AND VINEGAR

Using a sandwich bag, vinegar and a teaspoon of bicarb soda students were able to explore that a gas has capacity, can be compressed, fills a container and some were even able to explore what happens when the container reaches it's capacity. Students were eager to recreate this experiment at home. I hear it has had some interesting results!!!
